#### SPECIAL ISSUE: CHILDREN'S USES OF DIGITAL MEDIA

Cyberpsychology: Journal of Psychosocial Research on Cyberspace invites papers on the theme of **children's uses of digital media**. This is an open call for papers on topics related to children's reading, writing, play, learning and communication with digital technologies, including tablets, smartphones, desktops and emerging technologies.

The special issue will be published in **October 2017** and will be edited by Natalia Kucirkova (University College London, UK), Charles Mifsud (University of, Malta, Malta), Bieke Zaman (KU Leuven, Belgium) and Cristina Ponte (Universidade NOVA de Lisboa, Portugal). This special issue will be published in cooperation of the journal Cyberpsychology with COST Action IS1410 "The digital literacy and multimodal practices of young children" (DigiLitEY) and the ECREA TWG group Children, Youth and Media.

This special issue invites papers that build upon our understanding of children's contemporary practices with digital media, studied from quantitative, qualitative or mixed approaches, across the world.

Topics suitable for the special issue could include, but are not limited to, the following themes:

- Children's digital media uses worldwide
- Children's rights in today's digital society
- Trends, challenges, and opportunities in the digital ecology (e.g., the internet of things, augmented reality, 3D printing)
- Children's digital literacies
- Cross-generational research concerning children's digital media uses
- Methodological and ethical challenges in researching children's media use
- Challenges and opportunities arising from collaboration with the designers and publishers of digital technologies for children
- Policy implications for children's digital practices

# **Submission process and deadlines**

Expressions of interest should be submitted to journal assistant Lenka Dedkova (Idedkova@fss.muni.cz) in an e-mail attachment with the subject "Special Issue: Children's Uses of Digital Media" no later than 31st of January, 2017. Please include a 500-word abstract, full contact information, and a short biographical note (up to 75 words) for the author(s). If you are part of the DigiLitEY COST Action [IS1410] please make this clear in your submission. Any queries related to the special issue should be directed to the lead editor- Natalia Kucirkova at n.kucirkova@open.ac.uk.

Authors of accepted abstracts will be notified by **the 10<sup>th</sup> of February 2017** and will then be invited to submit a full paper. Manuscripts should be between 7,000 and 8,000 words (including tables and references), follow the *Cyberpsychology* style guidelines, and be submitted by **30<sup>th</sup> of April 2017**. Authors should have their papers edited and proofread before submitting. All papers will be subject to a blind peer review process.

**Prof Cristina Ponte** is Associate Professor with Habilitation at the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities (FCSH), Universidade NOVA de Lisboa, Portugal.
